UNIFORM AT THE PRIORY RUSKIN ACADEMY

Ruskin Academy has a strict uniform code that sets out exactly what to wear. A list of clothing can be found in this booklet. In addition to this, you will find a guide as to how the Academy uniform should be worn.

We seek the cooperation of students to wear their uniform with dignity and maturity.

- Shirts must be tucked in at all times.
- Trousers must be worn correctly and if required, the use of a plain black belt
- Tie length must be to the waist. Knots must be tight, and cover the top button. Top buttons must not be undone.
- Coats must be plain navy blue or black and without logos.
- Bags must be black or navy blue, plain in style (no large logos or patterns) and must be suitable to carry books and equipment (no handbags). Reflective strips (for safety reasons) can be used.
- If plastic bags are used for bringing in cooking ingredients, they must be plain. The use of plastic bags for carrying other items books and sports equipment is not acceptable.
- Skirts must be knee length.
- Hair must be not be an extreme style or colour, and no make up should be worn. KS4 may wear minimum makeup.
- Blazers and jackets can be removed in the summer, at the discretion of the Headteacher.
- Sleeves must not be rolled up, but short sleeve shirts may be worn.
- Jewellery plain gold/silver earring studs. One plain stud in each lower ear lobe.
- Scrunchies, Alice bands, winter hats, scarves and gloves must be plain navy blue or black. Hair slides either navy blue, black or the colour of the hair.

These standards must be observed whenever the Academy uniform is worn, including the journey to/from the Academy and when on Academy visits.

RENAISSANCE READING

Renaissance Reading is a programme that encourages students, in years 7 to 10, to engage with and enjoy reading. Students can choose a book from our well-stocked Reading Room or bring a book from home.

You will be able to engage with Renaissance Reading through tutor time and reading weeks. Reading weeks take place every term and allow students read a book of their choice during tutor time and for the first 15 minutes of each lesson.

Once a book is finished, you will be able to complete an age appropriate quiz to show your understanding. Completing these quizzes will contribute towards your reading passports and house competitions. Please be aware that some books from home may not be on the quiz system, so it is worth checking that they can be quizzed on.

Students who read, at home, for a further 20 minutes a day have been able to propel themselves further into advanced reading and we, at the Academy, would strongly encourage students to complete this.

Reading is also a very important part of the Ruskin Baccalaureate as students will need to complete one of the reading passports. Renaissance Reading is a perfect opportunity to support your Baccalaureate application.

Parents should be signing your planner to confirm that you have read for an extra 1 hour 40 minutes during a school week.

EXAM TIPS

BEFORE AN EXAM

- Practice answering some questions under exam conditions before the exam.
- Don't cram new information on the night before, read over your revision notes instead.
- Make sure you are well rested and relaxed before the exam get a good night's sleep the night before and get up in plenty of time to get ready.
- Check the time and place of the exam before you leave.
- Make sure you have the right equipment for the exam.
- Arrive with plenty of time to spare before the exam. If you rush you will lose focus and may become anxious.

DURING AN EXAM

- Read the instructions on the paper carefully and work out how long to spend on each part or question.
- It is a good idea to attempt compulsory sections first, then move on to optional questions.
- Most exam rooms should have a clock, but you may want to have your watch on your desk in front of you to keep a close eye on the time.
- Don't leave any questions out. Even if you are unsure how to answer a question, do attempt it, as you will not pick up any marks if you leave it out completely.
- Check over your answers when you have finished to spot any mistakes.
- Don't leave before the end unless you are certain you have finished.

AFTER AN EXAM

- Have a rest and relax or perhaps partake in some form of leisure activity.
- Forget the exams you have done and focus your attentions and efforts on your next exams. If you feel unsure of how you performed do not dwell on it.

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
