The Priory Ruskin Academy: Provider Access Policy

Introduction

This policy statement sets out the academy's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the academy for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the academy's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

- to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including apprenticeships and technical education – through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;
- to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic andtechnical courses.
