#### Ruskin Judged Outstanding Following Ofsted Inspection



We are delighted that Ruskin has been judged "outstanding" following our recent Ofsted inspection. The Academy was praised by inspectors for its "ambitious culture that encourages all pupils to achieve very highly, both academically and in their personal development". The inspectors found teaching to be of "high quality" and noted the "passion that pupils should achieve well" resulting in students making "very strong progress across the curriculum". Student behaviour was

commended with inspectors stating that "Pupils' behaviour is excellent" and that "Pupils are highly ambitious. They want to do well". Inspectors recognised the rounded nature of students' educational experience at the Academy noting the "wide ranging extra-curricular and enrichment activities" as well as the benefit students get from the Academy's commitment to spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. An accolade to the Academy's culture, the inspectors judged that "crucial to pupils' outstanding personal development, behaviour and welfare" is "the culture of respect and the positive relationships that underpin the school's work".

Rachel Wyles, Headteacher, commented, "This is a wonderful accolade for the Academy and a real testament to all the staff,

governors, students, parents and the Trust who have worked tirelessly for Ruskin. Our values are absolutely central to everything we do; excellent academic progress, engaging teaching and learning and an extensive, highly supportive pastoral system are a given. Where Ruskin truly excels is in its genuine and manifest sense of family, the absolute belief each young person can reach their potential in all aspects of Academy life and a creative enthusiasm to innovate and inspire. To have this recognised by Ofsted is incredibly rewarding. It is also great for the local community that following the town's success in this summer's examinations, which saw it lead the way in Lincolnshire in the government performance tables, a further Grantham school has been recognised for its outstanding provision."

### Ruskin Steps Up to Ambitious Fundraising Target





Ruskin students and staff had an epic fundraising week at the start of December, this time in support of one of our own...Angus Brown. Angus is in Year 10 and has Duchenne's Muscular Dystrophy, a condition that sees individuals suffer progressive loss of muscle function and weakness, and this eventually impacts on their quality of life.



Angus has been at the Academy since Year 7 and has had an active part to play, being a successful member of Mackintosh House and the Academy Boccia team. However, at present, Angus is getting weaker which is taking away his independence. Little things that most of us take for granted can be really hard for Angus but, when we knew there was a chance to help him get some of his independence back, we pulled together as an entire Academy community.

There is a mechanism called The Neater Arm Support that will allow Angus to independently take his arm through a range of movements which he would not normally be able to manage. It would give Angus the chance to do things, such as feeding himself, personal care activities and even the simplest of tasks like scratching his face or rubbing an eye, giving him



So, throughout the week commencing 4th December, Ruskin came together on a scale not seen before. There were sports competitions, sponsored silences, a non-uniform day, hot chicken wing eating competitions, head shaves, leg waxes, name the baby competitions to name just a few! And, incredibly we collectively raised £5241 by the end of the week. Amazing! As a result, the order has been put in and the aim is for us to have the arm fitted onto Angus' chair early January here at the Academy. The impact this will have on his life will be immense and it will be thanks to each and every member of the Ruskin Family. Well done to one and all.

#### Senior Maths Challenge

The senior maths challenge took place after half term with all Year 12 and 13 maths students entering. The UKMT Individual Maths Challenges are lively, intriguing multiple choice question papers, which are designed to stimulate interest in Maths in large numbers of students. We had Andrew Hall achieved best in year 12, with Sam Stanton also achieving a Bronze certificate. Ahkin Bautista achieved best in Year 13 and school, with Adam Garnett, Oliver Coleman and Muhammad Ahmad also achieving Bronze certificates. Overall a very successful entry from our A Level mathematicians in a competition which is extremely competitive and demanding!

The Intermediate Maths Challenge is taking place in February with 60 year 10 students taking part. The Junior Challenge will follow shortly with able mathematicians from year 8 entering.

#### Author Inspires Year 8

Year 8s have had a wonderful afternoon on the 7th November, spent in the company of author Ali Sparkes. As part of the Academy's programme of events for this term's Reading Week, Ali came in to talk to students about her latest book "Car-Jacked". A funny and engaging session...the students were absolutely captivated by Ali's enthusiasm and creativity and were able to buy a copy of her book and get it signed.



#### Sixth Form: Running Club Volunteers



Well done to these four Sixth Form students who volunteered, on a very cold November evening, to support Belvoir Tri Club, GRC and Grantham Athletics' charity event. The event saw runners of all ages taking part and the boys were time keepers for the event. It's fantastic to hear about all the events our students are an active part of outside the Academy gates and the role they play in our wider community.

#### Maths in Action

The KS5 Mathematicians attended a 'Maths in Action' day at The University of Warwick. The day focussed on how maths is used in real life and included topics such as: how mobile phones work, election voting, predicting populations in bacteria (and Game of Thrones!), penalty



shoot outs and where is the best place in the world to attempt world records. A thoroughly enjoyable and informative day which left the students head scratching at certain thoughts.

#### Students Partake In TALLIS Research

Twenty-eight Year 10 students have recently taken part in the TALLIS research which is happening internationally, investigating the teaching of quadratics. Over 4 weeks Miss Harborne's top set have been tested and surveyed, videoed during 2 lessons, and then tested to look for progress. The study hopes to identify strengths within the teaching of the topic and share this information across all schools taking part. Throughout the study our students were complimented on their excellent behaviour and attitude, and visitors to the school were impressed by the facilities available to students.

## Sports Digest Term 2

The Priory Ruskin Academy have achieved a first in the team; playing on a top class pitch there was table tennis this term. Having entered a girls team into the U14 Lincolnshire Table Tennis Championships the girls came out on top and will be progressing to the regional finals next half term. The boys came second to a very strong King's team. The matches throughout this competition were of a very high standard, well done to all involved.

The Year10 boys football team are having a superb run in the Elite Schools' National Cup. Having reached the last 16 they were drawn against Nene Valley of Peterborough, bringing 6 Peterborough United Academy players with them we were expecting a very challenging day. The lads stepped up to the challenge extremely well and came away victorious with a 3-2 win, taking them through to another home draw in the quarter finals. This is a great achievement and really highlights the strength in depth that this group of players have.



The Year 8 Boys football team are also making a great account of themselves in the county cup; the last round against Branston saw them win 2-1, with Branson being in last year's final there is now great hope for where the team could end the season.

This term a large number of Ruskin students competed in the annual District Cross Country Champs. We are extremely pleased to report that 10 students qualified for the district team and will race at the county championships on Saturday 20th January, along with 2 further nominations in the sixth form.

The U15 boys rugby continued their quest in the National Vase Competition. With a run to the fourth round we were set to play Worksop College away. This proved to be a great experience for

plenty of exciting running rugby to entertain. The opposition proved to be too strong for Ruskin, however the team made a great account of themselves scoring in the final play showing the result did not quash their efforts. The final result 40-12.



The U13 girls footballers fielded two teams in the district indoor futsal tournament. Both teams put on their best performances to date, which was highlighted in their final rankings in both leagues. Their determination, grit, team work and support for one another was outstanding. Team 1 finished winners of their league with team 2 finishing second. Team 1 played winners of league 2 to decide the overall champ and drew 1-1, taking the game to penalties. Unfortunately Ruskin lost 3-2 on penalties, this did not spoil what is a great achievement.

The Year 7 girls netball team have recently undertaken a friendly fixture vs Walton prior to the league fixtures beginning. This has proved very successful with regular excellent attendance at the girls training they came away winners in both the A and B squads. These girls have made a great start and we are sure will continue to do so with such great commitment.

The league badminton fixtures have begun with Ruskin comprehensively beating Kesteven and Sleaford High School at both U14 and U16. The boys begin their account next half term against Bourne Grammar. We are hoping to see a repeat of the last two years of success in this league competition, and are certainly hopeful of representation at the National Finals in May.
