Ruskin wins National Award For Excellent Results

The Priory Ruskin Academy has been recognised nationally for its excellent results in 2017 based on data from the Department of Education and Ofsted, analysed by SSAT (the Schools, Students and Teachers network). The Priory Ruskin Academy was found to be among the best performing secondary schools in the country, receiving an award for being in the top 20% of schools nationally for progress.

The SSAT Educational Outcomes database compares all state-funded schools in England, with the highest performing for a range of key measures presented with SSAT Educational Outcomes Awards, sponsored by Lexonik. The Priory Ruskin Academy will be presented with

their award in the summer term at a ceremony attended by winners from across the region.

Sue Williamson, Chief Executive of SSAT said: "I am delighted that The Priory Ruskin Academy has won an Educational Outcomes Award. This recognises an important aspect of the schools' work, but, as we know, there is much more to recognise in a good school like The Priory Ruskin Academy. SSAT is pleased to recognise the quality of leadership and the hard work of all

staff to ensure the success of every child. A big thank you and well done to pupils, parents, staff and governors."







The Priory Trust Comes Together In Celebration: Young Americans



The Young Americans returned to Grantham on the 6th and 7th March with a spectacular show bursting with the unique energy and passion that has become synonymous with the music and dance outreach group. The event, held at the Meres in Grantham, brought together 250 students from schools across The Priory Federation of Academies Trust in what was billed as 'The Priory Trust Celebration'.

Maths Feast events are designed to promote teamwork in mathematical problem solving and are organised by FMSP; an organisation who seek to promote challenge in mathematics across the curriculum and increase the uptake of mathematics at A-level.

Our teams enjoyed the experience thoroughly and most notably enjoyed the chance to participate in the more practical aspects of the tasks, that are rarely a part of normal maths lessons. Sixth Formers Explore Opportunities For Life After Ruskin

Sixth Form students attended the University and Apprenticeships Search Fair at the King Power Stadium Leicester in March. This was an exciting and informative event, providing the perfect way for students to begin the process of understanding which university or apprenticeship is right for them. Students had the opportunity to speak to a multitude of universities including, the University of Oxford, Russell Group, redbrick and modern institutions. Some of the UK's best apprenticeship providers, in sectors such as finance, engineering, media and retail, were also represented.

Sixth Form Psychology: Real Life Insight

On Thursday 8th March, a senior member of Leicester prison staff gave a talk about his role within the prison service to Year 13 Psychology students. The students had sent questions to their teacher in advance and these were forwarded on to the speaker. The questions concerned a range of issues including: the speaker's experience of working within a range of prisons, what kind of treatments might help offenders from reoffending and other broader issues such as whether he thought criminality was inborn or as a result of upbringing. The resulting conversation was both stimulating and thoughtprovoking as topics as wide as Norwegian prisons and the deathpenalty managed to find their way into the discussion. It is hoped that the visit will ultimately help students in their second year A-level Forensic Psychology unit.

Under 16 Girls Intermediate Competition: Performing their floor routine and 2 vaults Jessica Castell-Smith finished 2nd and Molly Aldous-Johnson finished in 1st, this was Molly's final year able to compete at this competition so it was a lovely final hurrah to her last competition! The under 16 successes led Ruskin into coming in 1st place in the team event, this being the first time Ruskin has taken this title.

Secondary Advanced Competition: Gymnasts in this category span the under 13 and under 16 age group and comprise of gymnasts who have won their respective intermediate competitions before. They compete the set intermediate floor routine and compete 2 vaults at the same time as the other intermediate competitors, but then they have to compete again with their own voluntary floor routine and 2 more vaults. All 4 scores are added up to get a total across the whole day. Ruskin's Alisha Shepherd took 1st place!

Under 13 Boys Competition: We had 1 competitor in this event and he is in Year 7 competing against gymnasts whom have not only done gymnastics for much longer but are older than him too. Alfie Webb stood up to this competition and also took 1st place.

Under 16 Boys Competition: Ruskin had three boys competing and the final results were extremely close: Lucas Kokocinski - 3rd, Kyle Davidson and Tom Charley joint 1st!

So much success being seen here. A huge thank you must be given to Jason Kettle for his continued and excellent work in developing our students into such incredible performers.

In the annual rugby 7s tournaments Ruskin saw a good level of skill and spirit result in medals returning to the Academy. The U15s winning the shield competition after beating De Aston in the final and the U12s finishing runners up.
