Students Experience Fascinating History of Justice



On Friday 29th June, the English Department took a group of 30 students to the National Justice Museum in Nottingham as part of their 'Crime and Punishment' Unit. They attended a court room workshop, where they all took an active role in a trial about knife crime. Several students deserve a particular mention here, including Dominic Marvin, who played the role of judge to perfection and went on to sentence the defendant to a particularly harsh 30 years in a high security prison and Daniel Arthur, who took on the role and demeanour of a very professional Prosecution Barrister and really rocked the wig! Each student took on a role, from Court Usher and Clerk to an array of convincing witnesses and a group of contemplative members of the Jury. The trial took around an hour to enact and was enacted in a decommissioned Court Room which still retained all the grandeur and splendour of a Victorian Court of Law.

In the afternoon students enjoyed a tour of the prison courtyard and viewed the gallows, listening to the story of a condemned prisoner who pointed us in the direction of the 'pit'. The boys – in particular – seemed to find the dummies of a sleeping prisoner terrifying and there were some healthy screams from the darker and more dingy areas of the prison! Following this, students went around the exhibition, viewing a variety of different prison cells and gaining lot of interesting and, at times, disturbing, information. They 'met' Elizabeth Fry who taught them all about Prison Reform and the importance of learning new skills and helping prisoners to turn their lives around whilst in jail. She also taught them all how to bow and curtsy properly – which was a bonus! Following on from this, students participated in a debate about Capital Punishment where each group was given a side to advocate.

Alton Towers: Year 11 Reward Trip



The Year 11 annual rewards trip to Alton Towers took place on Tuesday 26th June. Students invited to attend were being rewarded for their attainment, effort and achievement throughout this academic year. Each student has had a 'Ruskin Passport' - an incentive scheme that is unique to Ruskin Year 11 students and logs all academic progress across their curriculum. The Passport has been used to monitor individual progress and students who received this trip to Alton Towers have been committed to achieving outstanding progress.














Year 9 Design Technology Students Impress at Lincolnshire Show



On 20th & 21st June Year 9 Design students headed to The Lincolnshire Show to enter the Lincolnshire Schools Challenge. After three busy months researching and planning (including actually growing the potatoes!) they had ultimately devloped a new brand of potato based snacks. They produced all the marketing, packaging, logos, websites and uniform themselves for their brand – 'Ruskin's Special Spuds'.

On the Wednesday they pitched their project to three judges from the show and they did incredibly well under pressure. On the Thursday they were interviewed by BBC radio Lincolnshire which was aired the following morning.

Staff (Mrs Greenfield in particular!) are so proud of their achievements, they really represented Ruskin perfectly and showcased their skills.

Guest Student Article by Ben Doughty: Year 10 Geography Field Trip

On Monday 25th and Wednesday 27th June, Year 10 Ruskin Geography students journeyed to the Norfolk seaside area of Hunstanton for their physical Geography fieldtrip. During their visit, they collected data and surveyed the terrain of the coastal area. The group of Geographers were split into two sets: one set exploring the sand dunes and evaluating how they have formed and their role in coastal wildlife and defences; the other set scouted the beach, collecting measurements of the coastal defences and determining whether the defences are working efficiently to protect the coast. Later they set off into the town to issue the public with questionnaires, which would be collected and organised into data charts and graphs. The students asked the public whether the coast was aesthetically pleasing and if the coastal defences and sand dunes are sustainable and effective. Their results and collected data were written up and evaluated as it would be used as exam knowledge for the fieldtrip GCSE exam which they will sit in the summer of 2019. Overall the students enjoyed their trip and learnt facts and figures about the coast and the importance of teamwork.



Sports Digest Term 6

Term 6 has seen the culmination of all the athletics, rounders, cricket and tennis fixtures.

The junior boys completed the track and field cup after qualifying for the regional round. The final was organised and run by Ruskin staff and students, and saw a very high level of competition undertaken. The Ruskin junior boys' team finished 6th with a score of 293 points. At this event two performances really stood out; Brandon Allen who ran the 100m in 12.9 seconds and Charlie Plant in the 300m with a time of 42.7 seconds, both securing 21 points for their event. Joshua Crane of Year 10 competed in the Regional Combined Events Championships after qualifying first in Lincolnshire. Joshua had been placing a great deal of time into developing his throws of discus and javelin, the work certainly paid off with him increasing his score by over 200 points and finishing 10th at the regional event. Joshua is a year young and with continued focus it is hoped he will improve further next year. Lewis Davey also competed at the regional event for the senior boys, after a great last season Lewis had great expectations and he stood up to the challenge winning his first combined events as a senior athlete. Lewis also represented the county at the English Schools' Track and Field Championships in the 400m event. He came a very respectable 5th in the final with a time of 48.7 seconds. A previous student of the Academy, Praise Olalere, also competed at the nationals in the 200m, Praise came through all the previous round and

qualified for the final before finishing fourth in a time of 21.82 seconds.

The Academy is very pleased to announce that we have started to use Grantham Cricket Club for our home fixtures. The club has been very supportive in offering the pitch for our use which is certain to help us develop the numbers of students involved in the game and increase the standard of cricket. Our first fixture here was a success with the U13 team beating St George's Academy of Sleaford.

In tennis the teams have not seen quite the standard of success achieved last year. However there is a very good team developing in our junior boys with a very strong Year 7 contingent who will, in years to come, prove to be a true force to be reckoned with.

The annual Academy Sports Day was held on Friday 6th July. It was a great success with some excellent individual performances. There were a vast number of records broken and Knight were the final house winners on the day. A huge well done to all the students that took part in the day, to the students that supported their house teams and to all staff for enabling us to hold this great whole school event.
