Despite all of the challenges of the past year, five of our most determined KS4 students have achieved the Duke of Edinburgh bronze certificate. In order to achieve this they completed a range of activities including:

- 1 Development of a skill,
- 2 Voluntary work
- 3 Physical exercise.

In total this took 48 hours.

As part of this award, students have helped around their home completing housework, shopping for neighbours, mowing lawns and helping younger siblings with school work. Physical exercise has included running, cycling, dog walking and completing home workouts. An example of the work undertaken as part of the skills section included cooking, map reading, planning a charity coffee morning, brick laying and also skateboarding and also brick laying.

This has taken tremendous dedication and commitment, despite the disappointment of not being able to go on expedition. We are incredibly proud of these students and confident that the skillset developed will enhance their future opportunities!

REMEMBRANCE DAY 2020

On Remembrance Day students stood in silence to honour members of the armed forces who had died in the line of duty. As an Academy we like to support charities and feel it is more important than ever that the students support the Royal British Legion. The Covid 19 pandemic has left some in the Armed Forces community in dire need of urgent help. Year 7 Physicists

In September, The Priory Ruskin Academy was delighted to be invited to join the newly formed Physics Partnership along with other schools in Grantham, in association with The Ogden Trust. The aim of the Partnership is to raise awareness of physics and support schools with projects and programmes to enhance learning.

At Ruskin, we have recently held our first physics related enrichment activity. This took the form of a quiz on general physics knowledge as well as famous physicists. The competition was aimed at our Year 7 cohort and we had over 80 students compete. It was a tense race with Mackintosh and Hepworth both entering the same amount of participants but the Mighty Mackintosh managed to pull away and eventually took the lead by a massive 30 points!

Chloe S from Hepworth House was the individual overall winner who scored an incredible 40 out of 42 points. When asked about which famous scientist she would most like to interview and why, Chloe's response was, 'Sir Isaac Newton because he discovered gravity'.

Well done to everyone who entered—we look forward to working with other schools within the partnership and further House enrichment activities.

Year 9 Engineers - Dyson Project



As part of the BTEC Engineering course students have been learning how things work by taking them apart! Year 9 Engineering students have been working with a box of vacuum cleaner parts provided by the James Dyson Foundation. Students have been investigating the different polymers used in its manufacture and their properties.

After dismantling the carbon fibre turbine tool and the tangle-free turbine head three intrepid Y9 students, Hayden E, James W and Rachel H took on the challenge of the DC39 vacuum cleaner. The students have enjoyed getting their hands on a real product and improving their practical skills while learning about p oly c a r b o n a t e s,



polyoxymethylene and acrylonitrile butadiene styrene (ABS).

In future lessons students will learn about the processes which formed the components of the Dyson vacuum cleaner and develop an understanding of product specifications.


Hospitality and Catering. They have made a great start to the course by cooking a variety of dishes including cookies, minestrone soup and macaroni cheese.

Good luck Year 11.


COVID 19—Christmas Period

Further to auidance received from the DFE, we wish to remind you that when students or staff develop symptoms of Covid 19 on or before Sunday 20th December and test positive following these symptoms or have a test on or before Sunday 20th December if they are asymptomatic, the Academy will support in tracing close contacts and informing families where other children need to isolate. In line with DFE guidance, this service will be available up to and including 24th December (after this date, you should use the NHS Test and Track system). If this is the case we ask that you email the Academy using the following email address:

Please include in the email your child's details along with the date they started to show symptoms, the date of the test and positive outcome. We will then take the necessary steps to identify and inform any close contacts.

If a child or staff member develops symptoms after Sunday 20th December, the Government guidance regarding testing and medical support should be followed; pupils and staff should follow contact-tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.


