This was a joyous afternoon showing our local community Ruskin spirit at its best.




Christmas Jumper Day!

RESULTS FROM THIS TERM:

Football: The U15 girls are going strong in the National Cup, progressing to the last 32. This is a fantastic achievement in itself as there were over 400 teams that entered the competition. The U13 girls team have had a good run in the National Cup however they got knocked out to a very strong side last week. U12, U13, U14 and U16 boys teams are still in the County Cup—with the U16 team through to the quarter finals. We have a strong attendance in football training and have fielded A and B teams in most year groups. We are hoping this level of participation continues.

Netball: We have had a busy term of netball playing fixtures in the Sisters N Sport competition and competing in the district netball tournaments. Our U15 team won the district tournament and are currently the only team left in the Sisters N Sport competition. The Year 8, 9 and 11 teams played well in the competition but were knocked out in the second round.

Rugby: This term all of our rugby teams have competed in the Newark Rugby Festivals against local schools. We have also had all year groups playing against St. George's Academy. Two teams have gone unbeaten throughout this term: the U14 Boys team who are developing well with half of the team now playing at Kesteven and the Girls U16 team who had a very dominant display at Newark Rugby Club.

Gymnastics: There are 20 students who attend gymnastics club, most training both in and out of school. At the Lincolnshire Schools Gymnastics Competition recently the U14 team came second and three of them also placed individually. In the U19 age group, two of the students placed. In January they are competing in the East Midlands regional qualifier for BSGA Milano Gymnastics and BSGA Floor and Vault.

Cross Country: Both the Junior Boys and Junior Girls teams went to the Grammar School in Leeds on 12th November to compete in a very tough regional competition, finishing 8th and 12th respectively. Over 35 students represented Ruskin at the District Cross Country at Belton House on 16th November, where a number of our students qualified for the next round in January.
