Duke of Edinburgh students at The Priory Ruskin Academy were delighted to see their 'Basecamp Bar' officially opened by Sainsbury's, Grantham on Thursday 17th March.

The healthy snack bar is the brain child of the dedicated group who have set up this venture as part of their skills and volunteering sections of the Award. Utilising their varied talents, the students have taken responsibility for designing the logo, signage uniforms, menus, loyalty cards and packaging as well as organising the staffing of the bar, all food preparation and baking and stock control, pricing, cash flow and book keeping. The bar, which is initially opening two

days a week, is open in the morning and at break and lunch with competitive pricing and the clear aim of promoting healthy eating within the Academy.

Mrs Greenfield, Duke of Edinburgh Coordinator at the Academy, said, "The D of E runs from fundraising alone, so students are tasked with making money in order to fund their expeditions, buy equipment and pay for exciting events like rock climbing. The students have worked really hard over the last few weeks to prepare for today and watching them work for this has really made myself and Mr Dale (D of E Leader) proud - they are a great bunch of young people and I wish them all the best in their business venture. 




One Last Time..

Covering 25,000

miles over 4 1/2 years, Sarah had to endure extreme conditions and overcome many challenges. Mr Gunter, Director of Sport at the Academy, said, "Sarah's story is an inspiration and demonstrates to our students what can be achieved with tenacity, passion and commitment."

Ruskin Makes The Top 100

Staff and students at The Priory Ruskin Academy have more cause for celebration having received official notification that the Academy is one of the top 100 non-selective state-funded schools in England for progress. In a letter from Nick Gibb MP, the Minister of State for Schools, the Academy was praised for showing 'the greatest sustained pupils achieving five or more A*-C grades, including English and Mathematics GCSE'. Data released in January putting the Academy in the top 3 schools in Lincolnshire for both GCSE and A level value added.

We have a unique improvement in the percentage of enthusiasm and vitality at Ruskin; we are absolutely driven in securing the best outcomes for our students and I am incredibly pleased that our energy, enthusiasm and tenacity has been

recognised. We have a truly inspirational staff and a hard working student body - this really is a testament to them."






The Year 10 GCSE Performing Arts students put on a wonderful evening of entertainment on March 10th. The performance, known as the 'Inspire Concert',

Well, what a term it has been in The Priory Ruskin Academy PE Department! The half term was jam packed with fixtures and county finals that were excellently represented by Academy students. Term 4 saw the Academy enter teams at the Winter School Games in Badminton, New Age Kurling and Rowing, competing in the county finals of these events!

Within Badminton the girls team, consisting of Mel Church, Romaizza Herrera, Lucie Plant and Jade Sinclair, finished a very respectable 6th in the county. The boys team of George Railton, Gytis Vysniauskas, Korban Read and Callum Turner performed superbly well and finished in 2nd place behind a very strong William Farr team.



The newly developed New Age Kurling team took on the challenge of competing against Lincolnshire's best, played smartly, were cool under pressure and took home the Gold medals. The students representing this team were Liam Atkinson, Peter Merryweather, Markus Cotterill, Kyle Morton and Angus Brown.

Medals were also brought back to the Academy from the rowing team; the Year 8 team of Caius Hamilton, Piotrek Kudla and Zak Draycott bringing home Gold, and the Year 10 team (Alec Stewart, Jack Pirie, Logan Grieh and Ben Tunnicliffe) achieving Silver.





The football fixtures have now come to an end with the U15 team topping the district league. Two notable results from this team were a 6-0 win over Carre's Grammar School and a 4-0 win over local rivals Kings to secure the top spot. We are hoping that this team can continue this success next year and have a good run in the National Cup.



The first 11 football team have played 16 fixtures in the league format and finished in third place, after the success of this year we are hoping to run two teams out of the Sixth Form next year.



Rugby has turned from the 15 a side game to 7s; the U13 boys had a good run in the County Championships at Market Rasen RFC, qualifying for the top cup competition after finishing 2nd in their group, were then

knocked out at the quarter final stage by De Aston A team. The U15 boys' team qualified for the plate competition and took home silverware after finishing runners up. The girls have also had a good run in rugby attending the county rugby festival at Lincoln RFC; the U13 team finished in second place and the U15 team finished joint 1st with KSHS.

There has been further success with the Gymnastics team who have achieved much greater feats than any previous year. Some major highlights from the Grantham Gymnastics results were; Neeve Pexton winning Gold in U13 novice category, U13 intermediate girls Alisha Shepherd won Gold, U13 boys



Joe Taylor won Gold and Toby Doughty won Bronze, U16 Girls novice Abbie Phillips won Gold, and in the U16 boys Kyle Dickinson won Gold. In the team event the U13 girls also took the Silver medals home. This is by far our best results in this competition.



The girls' netball training has seen continued high numbers attend and this is really showing in their levels of performance. The U13 team were invited to attend the DRET league at meres and finished in a very pleasing 4th position from a very strong field of eight teams. The Year 7 team outplayed local rivals Walton

winning 11-6, and the year 8s beat Will Rob 5-1.
