Year 10 Explore Norfolk Coastline

On Thursday 26th and Friday 27th May, Year 10 GCSE Geography students visited the coast at Hunstanton in Norfolk. The visit was a compulsory element of GCSE Geography for their assessed piece of coursework. The students were investigating coastal management techniques in the area. The day started with a quick debrief and field sketch of the unique red and white striped cliffs at Hunstanton. Students were even lucky enough to bump into local legend, Michael Kennedy, a 73 year old man who is single-handedly building a sea wall out of pebbles at the base of the cliff. Mr Kennedy stopped and talked to the students about the work he was doing and why he was doing it, they even got chance to add a few pebbles of their own to his sea wall.

Later that morning, students had to use a range of fieldwork equipment such as measuring tapes, meter sticks and ranging poles to answer their enquiry questions for their coursework and record data. The students worked in groups at specific points near coastal management techniques in the area; to complete their fieldwork they used environmental quality surveys, bipolar surveys and transect lines to measure beach sediment.

Lunchtime saw the students take the chance to go off and buy a classic seaside lunch of fish and chips, which went down a treat after a long morning of Geography work. The students worked really well and it is fantastic to see what we have been studying out in the real world.



Year 5 Students Enjoy a Taste of Mathematics at Secondary School





As part of our primary liaison programme, the Academy welcomed ninety students, sixty-one girls and twenty-nine boys, from local primary schools on July 1st. Students participated in a variety of mathematical workshops involving a wide range of skills and concepts such as three dimensional work, an algebraic trail, Rangoli patterns and measuring activities. There were plenty of budding mathematicians who clearly enjoyed themselves with one student saying, 'I enjoyed going outside to work, collaborating, and best of all meeting new teachers', whilst a parent commented, 'My daughter thoroughly enjoyed the morning and came out with a boost of confidence telling me all about it'.
